Conference venue and arrival registration

The conference will take place at Birger Jarl Hotel and Conference, Tulegatan 8b, SE 104 32 Stockholm Sweden, +46 8674 1800, birgerjarl.se.

The conference venue is located in the city centre of Stockholm. From Stockholm's Central Station you can take a 20-minute walk or the green underground line (you need to buy a ticket card) to Rådmanngatan, exit "Tegnergatan" and then a 5-minute walk to the hotel.

Taxi from the Central Station is another alternative. For those not staying at the conference hotel there is an entrance to the conference from Birger Jarlsgatan 61 A.

More information about hotel booking will be available at the conference website sygeplejekonference.dk. On the website you will be able to find hotels in different price ranges, all located close by the conference hotel. It is recommended that you book your room in advance. Most hotel rooms in central Stockholm are usually booked in June.

Arrival registration will be at the registration desk at Birger Jarl Conference in the entrance from Birger Jarlsgatan 61 A. The registration desk will be open between 13.00–14.00 hours on the 15th June for those attending the pre-seminars. On Thursday the 16th June the registration desk will open at 8 o'clock and the scientific programme begins at 9 o'clock.

Registration

Online registration will be open from October 1st, 2015 at sygeplejekonference.dk. We encourage you to register your participation in the conference as early as possible to secure a place in the reception at the City Hall, as the number of participants is limited.

The official language at the conference is English. All presentations both in plenum and parallel sessions will be in English.
