Conference venue and arrival registration

The conference will take place at Oslo and Akershus University College of Applied Sciences, Pilestredet 32, 0130 Oslo.

The conference venue is located in the city centre of Oslo. From National teatret Station it is a 10-minute walk to the University College. The tram also stops close by at Holbergs place. There are several hotels in the area within walking distance to the University College.

Most hotel rooms in central Oslo are usually booked in June.

On Thursday the 14th June the registration desk will open at 8:00 and the scientific programme begins at 8:30.

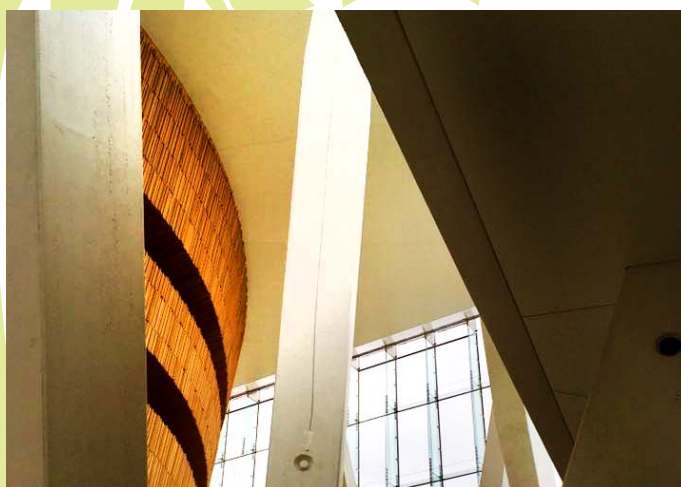
